Mobile Access North Yorkshire - part of a wider community

The Mobile Access North Yorkshire project is the second phase of Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport 5G testbed and trial initiative meaning the project has been informed from previous outcomes. Importantly it allows you to find out how this type of project can help you.

Liverpool 5G

Liverpool 5G is a consortium of public sector health and social suppliers, the NHS, university researchers, third sector organisations, SMEs and a leading UK5G technology vendor. The consortium created a fully connected care home, demonstrated the technology potential to improve people's health and wellbeing; and demonstrated potential technological solutions for health and social care services that can reduce the cost of services and create extra capacity. Using a 5G network the consortium tested whether it would be cost effective to give free access to those unable to afford either phone or broadband access.

One of the projects was to enable a pharmacy video link meaning patients could take medicine safely at home. One user of the system, Joan, stated *'the new service has made a lot of difference to me, it makes me feel safer. Sometimes when I fall asleep I don't know whether I have taken my medication but I get 4 phone calls a day which means I have someone ringing to remind me but also, answer any questions, and explain things. I used to have carers but often had to wait for them to arrive; sometimes they were an hour late because of traffic. This system means they just ring me - I think the system is wonderful'*.
